CRYING IT OUT

God's gift of children brings tremendous joy to our lives. One of the least joyful moments for parents—if they so choose—is the process of letting their children "cry it out." One of the first occasions of an infant's life that this takes place is transition to a crib, alone in their own room. Isn't this extremely difficult? To sit there and do nothing while watching your child in wrenching discomfort and listening to them wail at the top of their lungs via a video monitor. Of course, you know it is, if you've ever let one of your children "cry it out." Sometimes, I gave in with our first child, and my wife would inform me that I was hindering the process. His "crying it out" was essential to his growth and strength.

Curtis A. Cates, a dear encourager and Bible instructor who has passed on to his reward, once said, "I believe the greatest sufferer in the book of Job was Jehovah God." Except for Jesus', the suffering of Job is the grandest record we have of the extent to which a human being has suffered. Job lost all 10 of his children in one day (Job 1:18-19). On that same day, he lost his financial wealth and a number of servants (Job 1:13-17). Soon thereafter, his health was smitten to the point that his wife thought he would be better off dead (Job 2:7-9). If that was not enough, three friends began to tell him how he must have done something very ungodly to be receiving such a punishment. Job knew he did nothing to deserve this hurt, and he believed God was the

one persecuting him, but he still did not want to turn his back on God. God allowed Job to endure such tremendous suffering by the hand of the devil in order to prove He has faithful servants and to provide an inspired record from which we can learn. How hard must it have been for God while Job suffered? To sit there and do nothing while watching him in wrenching discomfort and listening to him wail at the top of his lungs.

The next time you are "crying it out" because of the inevitable hardships of life, the undeserved suffering of illness, or the ungodly persecution from the world, and you are tempted to think that God has forgotten you, remember the words of James: "Indeed we count them blessed who endure. You have heard of the perseverance of Job and seen the end intended by the Lord—that the Lord is very compassionate and merciful" (James 5:11). And, remember that it is essential to your growth and strength (James 1:2-9).
